SUBJECT: National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Equipment Assistance
Grant 2022

Michigan has been selected to receive over \$700,000 in federal funds to provide local school food authorities (SFAs) with grants to purchase, renovate, install, and/or replace food service equipment. These grant funds are intended to help schools serve healthier meals with four areas of focus: serving more fruits and vegetables, improving food safety and energy efficiency, improving meal quality, and expanding access to school meal programs.

The application deadline for the grant is October 8, 2021.

Who Can Apply?

Any SFA participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) or the NSLP Seamless Summer Option (SSO) including:

- Public School Districts
- Public School Academies
- Intermediate School Districts
- Nonpublic School Districts
- Residential Child Care Institutions

Grant Criteria:

This is a competitive grant consistent with federal requirements. Priority is required to be given to:

- High need school buildings where 50% or more of the enrolled students are eligible for free or reduced-price meals (e.g., schools in underserved areas, schools with limited access to other resources, or schools with very old equipment).

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- First time applicants: SFA buildings and sites that have not received this grant in the past under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) or the FY 2010, FY 2013, FY 2014, FY 2015, FY 2016, FY 2017, FY 2018, and FY 2019 federal Agriculture Appropriations Acts.
- Districts that can demonstrate how the effectiveness of the equipment purchased will reflect the intent of the grant to serve healthier meals with four areas of focus: serving more fruits and vegetables, improving food safety and energy efficiency, improving meal quality, and expanding access to school meal programs.

Equipment requests may include:

- New equipment
- Renovation of equipment
- Installation costs
- Replacement of equipment

Federal regulation 2 CFR Part 200.33 defines equipment as “articles of nonexpendable, tangible personal property with a useful life of more than one year and a per unit acquisition of \$5,000 or more,” or the lesser amount that is established in the SFA’s capitalization policy.

Grant amounts:

Maximum: \$25,000 per building/site

Minimum: \$1,000 per piece of equipment, not in aggregate

These values do not include the cost of installation and/or any delivery fees.

Application Timelines:

The grant application opened on August 30, 2021 through the Michigan [NexSys](#) system. NexSys will use MILogin third-party access. Users can register for a third-party account at: <https://milogintp.michigan.gov>. Review the [Creating a MILogin Account](#) for detailed steps on creating a MILogin account, linking your MEIS/MILogin accounts, and requesting access to NexSys. The equipment assistance grant will be listed as the CNP: NSLP Equipment Assistance Grant under Fiscal Year 2022 in NexSys. The application must be initiated by a “Level 5” authorized official or a “Level 4” application administrator. Grant applications are due on Friday, October 8, 2021. It is expected that grant funding will be awarded by October 24, 2021.

SFAs must complete their procurement and expenditure activities by September 30, 2022. SFAs will be required to submit quarterly reports on the progress of grant activities until all funds provided are spent.

Procurement of Equipment:

Federal procurement regulations in 7 CFR Part 210.21 and 2 CFR Part 200.317-326 apply to this grant. Equipment competitively procured using these grant funds must be necessary, reasonable, and allocable. For example, while using these grant funds to purchase a walk-in freezer for school food service or a salad bar may be an allowable cost, building an extension to a cafeteria would not meet the intended purposes of this grant. This is per USDA FNS memo [SP 17-2020](#), page 2. Each SFA is responsible for ensuring that their procurement and contracts comply with all applicable laws, regulations, program instructions, and guidance materials.
