**SUBJECT:** Perkins Regional Allocations 2021-2022 Estimates

On May 29, 2020, the United States Department of Education (USED) approved the Michigan 4-year State Plan, covering Fiscal Years (FY) 2020-23, to implement the requirements of the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006, as amended by the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V). As outlined in the state plan, the Michigan Department of Education distributes Perkins’ funding to 27 regional consortiums.

The Michigan Department of Education – Office of Career and Technical Education (MDE – OCTE) is pleased to provide the estimated Career and Technical Education (CTE) Perkins Regional Allocations for 2021-2022 school year. Below is a breakdown by region:
