Roadmap to Reopening Safely and Meeting All Students' Needs -

This memorandum is to share <u>Volume 2 of the U.S. Department of Education's COVID-19 Handbook series</u> designed to provide additional strategies for safely reopening schools and promote educational equity by addressing opportunity gaps that have been exacerbated by the pandemic.

As you may recall, in March you were <u>provided</u> a link to <u>Volume 1</u> of the handbook, which focused on health and safety measures that schools can use to successfully implement guidance of the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Volume 2 of the handbook focuses on research-based strategies to address the social, emotional, mental health, and academic impacts of the pandemic on students, educators, and staff, such as how to address any potential anxiety or depression some may face as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and nearly a year of remote learning.

The strategies described in this volume can be supported by federal funding under the American Rescue Plan. Its sections, which include strategies and considerations for meeting the needs of underserved students, include:

- Creating Safe and Healthy Learning Environments—school meals, social emotional and mental health, and providing a safe and inclusive environment.
- Addressing Foregone Instructional Time—accelerating learning, supporting equitable access and effective use of technology, and using data to target resources.
- Supporting Educator and Staff Stability and Well-Being—stabilizing a diverse and qualified educator workforce and supporting educator and staff well-being.
